## PROJECT OF THE MONTH

This month's winner is SI Lumière Bamako (Mali) for their project "Drilling for the women of Bandiagara". The Programme Focus Objective of this project is no. 5: Improve access to clean water, sanitation and essential food resources.

The main objective of this project is to provide clean drinking water for women of Bandiagara by installing drilling pumps. The women of Bandiagara lack safe drinking water and need water for the production of vegetables. The SI Club of Lumière Bamako worked in partnership with SI Messina and SI Lipari from Italy. The project is completed and the women can use the water pump. Nonetheless, more funds are needed to build a fence around the vegetable garden.

According to PFR no. 19328, the funds raised were \$12,250, 30 women and 20 girls were helped and the members have dedicated more than 200 hours for the project. Congratulations!

### **May 15 – International Day of Families**



International Day of Families is observed on May 15<sup>th</sup> of every year in order to create awareness of issues related to families. This day should give governments and communities around the world the opportunity to reflect upon ways to promote policies which enhance women's decision-making ability, promote equality between the sexes, enhance women's equal participation in employment and shared parental responsibility. This year's theme is "Confronting Family Poverty and Social Exclusion."

### **May 21 – World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development**

The World Day for Cultural Diversity for Dialogue and Development, celebrated on May 21<sup>st</sup>, will give Soroptimists the opportunity to deepen our understanding of the values of cultural diversity. It is crucial to recognize that tolerance and respect for diversity enhance the

potential of culture as a means of achieving prosperity, sustainable development and global peaceful coexistence. That's why Soroptimist Programme Focus Objective no. 8 intends to "promote peaceful conflict resolution, inter-cultural and inter-racial tolerance and condemn genocide and terrorism". Soroptimists can use this occasion to celebrate cultural rights and dialogue by inviting those around them to participate in the cultural life of their community, express themselves, share knowledge of their culture, and reflect upon ways in which we can encourage respect for cultural identity.
