



## PROJECT OF THE MONTH

This month, the Programme Team would like to honour SI Tirana (Albania) for their Advocacy project “Media Training on HIV/AIDS”. The Programme Focus Objective of this PFR is: Support programmes and policies that eliminate HIV/AIDS, malaria and tuberculosis and other major diseases.

This project was realized in partnership with the local NGO STOP AIDS. It addresses the importance of awareness creation among key media representatives which will result in improved HIV/AIDS prevention. Comparatively, Albania’s HIV/AIDS rate is low but risks are present and the local media has been passive in providing information. Hence meetings with media directors and trainings for journalists were organized and a partnership was forged between the Tirana club and a pool of journalists.

PFR no. 18099 describes how articles by trained journalists informed people correctly on the main HIV/AIDS prevention measures. This is a health issue which is much stigmatized in Albania. The club recommends that “these efforts on this subject should be continued, because the needs are evident”.

### Soroptimist Project Matching

This month, we feature the project "UKR0001 - Ready for Life". SI Kiev, Ukraine, seeks to help visually impaired girls living in a boarding school to develop their skills and improve their living conditions for their future. 51 girls from the age of 6 to 17 years are currently living in the boarding school in Boyarka, a town close to Kiev. They all have poor vision. Coming from very poor families or being orphans, they are staying at the boarding school to receive an education.

The SI Club Kiev has been in contact with the boarding school for over 10 years and knows the needs. The goal of the project is to help visually impaired girls to become independent, provide an education for them and address their health issues. **Funding needed: 2360 EUR**
