This month's winner is SI Cremona (Italy) for their advocacy project "Positive Female Role Models". The Programme Focus Objective of this project is no. 10: Assure women's advancement in management, politics and decision-making.

The goal of SI Cremona Club's initiative is to celebrate women's achievements and create awareness on girls' education. They organized meetings to discuss the importance of civil and moral support for the younger generation. Cremona invited female role models to present their experiences and reflect on the importance of commitment and determination to succeed.

SI Cremona partnered with the Liceum, the State Archives, ANISA and other women's organizations in Cremona. In partnership with these entities, SI Cremona wanted to inform the participants of equal dignity and respectful relationship between the sexes.

PFR no. 20391 asserts that they succeeded in informing and educating more than 250 women (out of which 100 were girls) about women and leadership.

First Round Successfully Completed

The first European Mentoring Programme held its final seminar in Malmö for mentees and mentors from the Belgian, German, Luxembourg and Swedish Unions in early June. Participants and coordinators alike praised the first SI/E "Advancing Women" programme, which was realized in collaboration with EAF – European Academy for Women in Politics and Business. The mentees were highly enthusiastic about the experience and impressed by Soroptimist as a whole. In fact, some have already expressed an interest in joining their local clubs. The organizers intend on putting together a PowerPoint presentation about the nine-month programme, which can be used for PR. In line with the SI Long-Term theme "Education and Leadership", SI/E hopes to expand this excellent programme to further Unions. The call for the next round is planned for November 2012.

This month, we feature the project: “KE0001 – Transport and home library empowerment initiative”. SI Club Nakuru in Kenya intends to improve access to school and make the home study environment more conducive for young rural girls in the Mitimongi Zone. This project aims at introducing affordable and secure means of transportation as well as setting up a home library infrastructure. To protect rural girls from often unsafe and unpredictable journey, Club Nakuru plans to provide 30 secondary school girls with bicycles and to construct a parking area for bicycles at schools.

July 11 – World Population Day

Just fourteen years after the UN marked the Day of Five Billion, the world’s population is poised to reach 7 billion in 2011. Support for the Day of Five Billion has grown into World Population Day, which is celebrated on July 11th each year to increase awareness about population issues and their effect on the planet.

Last year’s theme was “Everyone Counts,” emphasizing the need for accurate demographics to efficiently plan schools, health systems, public transportation and humanitarian aid, among other things. With information from the 2010 census UNPFA, the United Nations Population Fund can illustrate certain trends like progress toward meeting the

MDGs and identify what groups are being overlooked. Secretary General Ban Ki-Moon highlighted this relationship between census data and representation in his statement “to be counted is to be visible.”



The UNFPA Executive Director directly connected 2010’s theme to women and girls by explaining that demographics can be a precursor to the development of programmes that “ensure that every pregnancy is wanted, every birth is safe...and every woman is treated with dignity and respect.” There are currently 350 million couples without either knowledge or access to contraceptives and 3 billion people are of reproductive age today. Through empowering, informing and protecting women, issues like these and population growth can be addressed and possibly solved. However, this action is only possible with proper knowledge of these women’s location, social situation and access to resources, all of which can be attained through data analysis of a census.

The theme of this year’s World Population Day has yet to be announced but www.unfpa.org has suggestions for ways to celebrate, posters, videos and fact sheets available. As usual, there will be worldwide activities and celebrations to commemorate this day!
