



Tour A Language: German

Guided tour "Women and Power" - Abbesses, Beguines and the upheavals of the Reformation

Women once ruled Zürich! The abbesses of the Fraumünster not only shaped the city for many centuries in terms of culture, politics and economics, they were, for some time, the unchallenged rulers of the city. However, when Katharina von Zimmern handed over the Fraumünster Abbey to the city in 1524, women lost their political voice for a long time.

In addition to the Fraumünster Abbey, there were other women's convents in Zürich, and numerous beguines were part of the community in the pre-Reformation Zürich.

On the tour we gain an insight into what lay behind the convent walls, and into how the role of women oscillated between power and powerlessness, as well as the changes in marriage and morals brought about by the reformation.

Guided tour of the Merzbacher and Bührle collection at Kunsthaus Zürich

The Kunsthaus Zürich, the largest art museum in Switzerland, presents over eight centuries of art history. The collection ranges from the Middle Ages to the present day and includes paintings, sculptures, installations, photographs, videos and digital works, which can be seen in changing exhibitions.

In this guided tour, we learn more about the two private collections Merzbacher and Bührle, their backgrounds and masterpieces.

Guided tour "Zürich's strong women"

Following in the footsteps of strong women, we learn how pioneering women, fighters and politicians have shaped and continue to shape Zürich to this day. Is it possible to drive out an army without shedding blood? The brave women of Zürich once managed to do just that. Despite considerable resistance, they helped shape Zürich's development for centuries, the scientific field, in culture and literature, as pioneers, politicians, advocates and as strong women alongside many successful Zürich men.

On this tour of the city, you will visit places that illustrate the work and achievements of influential women such as Adele Duttweiler, Franziska Dosenbach, Nadesha Suslowa, Johanna Spyri, Mileva Maric, Katharina von Zimmern.
